CLD year-end awards are for specific Horse/Rider combinations. Each horse or rider must be nominated on a separate form. Fees must be paid BEFORE scores will be counted and membership fees must be current. Horse/rider combinations may be paid annually (\$10.00) or you may elect a lifetime nomination (\$35.00) for each horse/rider combination.

BOTH OWNER & RIDER MUST BE MEMBERS OF CLD TO PARTICIPATE

USDF Membership Benefits: USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the USDF Directory or the USDF Web site at www.usdf.org.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership, Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF NM fee. (Note: USDF business members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership (BM).)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized shows must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)
Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, Pas de Deux, Quadrille, or FEI ParaEquestrian classes, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot and academy classes. For foreign-owned horses competing in a CDI, USDF accepts copies of the horse identification pages from an FEI passport in lieu of a USDF HID or Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) number.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$62), 5-years (\$250), or life (\$1,000). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$35). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF- licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals, and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$175) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$20 and a USDF NM form per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF member there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF Web site.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$20). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes or Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$65. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$85) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals and Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Non-Member (NM) identification number, Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF Web site: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online, print, fax or mail it.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date received by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary on that same day.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS AT THE PRELIMINARY LEVEL OR ABOVE AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS AT THE ADVANCED LEVEL, DRESSAGE, REINING AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS AND ENDURANCE RIDES. A NONMEMBER MAY PARTICIPATE AS A HANDLER, RIDER, DRIVER, OWNER, LESSEE, AGENT, COACH OR TRAINER AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS, DRESSAGE COMPETITIONS, REINING COMPETITIONS AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS UPON PAYMENT OF A \$30 NONMEMBER REGISTRATION FEE. PARTICIPANTS IN THE FOLLOWING CLASSES ARE EXEMPTED FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS RULE: 1) LEADLINE; 2) EXHIBITIONS; 3) GAMES AND RACES; 4) CLASSES FOR 4-H MEMBERS; 5) WALK TROT AND ACADEMY CLASSES (ACADEMY CLASSES ARE CLASSES LIMITED TO HORSES USED REGULARLY IN A LESSON PROGRAM); 6) USDF INTRODUCTORY LEVEL TESTS, PAS DE DEUX AND QUADRILLE CLASSES; 7) NRHA ENDORSED REINING COMPETITIONS. 8) OPPORTUNITY CLASSES, 9) CITIZENS OF OTHER NATIONS WHO HAVE PROOF, IN ENGLISH, OF CURRENT MEMBERSHIP IN GOOD STANDING OF THEIR OWN NATIONAL FEDERATION, 10) USEA BEGINNER NOVICE DIVISION; AND 11) ASSISTANT HANDLERS IN DRESSAGE SPORT HORSE BREEDING CLASSES.

2. **USEF:** EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT U.S. EQUESTRIAN RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH. The management reserves the right to make any changes deemed necessary; to combine, divide or limit classes as entries warrant; and to refuse any entry without reason.

3. **Health Papers:** Negative Coggins dated within 1 year of the show must be submitted for all horses at all shows including schooling shows. Submit a copy with your entries. All equines entering Illinois must be accompanied by the following: 1) Negative test for EIA (Negative Coggins) conducted within 1 year if the animal is more than one year of age; and 2) Certificate of veterinary inspection issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days of entry with a permit number issued by the Illinois Department of Agriculture on the health papers. *IL Diseased Animals Act (510 ILCS 50/1) Violators shall be fined not less than \$50 nor more than \$1,000.*

4. **Entries:** The enclosed generic entry blank will be the only acceptable entry form for the shows listed in this omnibus. Make copies of the form for each show. **(DO NOT INCLUDE USEF DRUG OR USEF NON-MEMBER FEES ON SCHOOLING SHOW ENTRIES.)**

5. **Food:** Food will be available for purchase on show grounds on all show days.

6. **Motorized Vehicle:** In accordance with GR901.29: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer (s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

7. **Numbers:** The horse's competition number must be worn not only while competing, but also while schooling your horse on the grounds.

8. **Post Entries:** Post entries will be accepted only to fill cancellations.

9. **Refunds:** Full refund less Office Fee will be made on or before closing date. No entries will be processed unless paid in full. NO REFUNDS WILL BE MADE AFTER THE CLOSING DATE.

2010 USDF/Dover Saddlery Adult Amateur Medal Program

The USDF/Dover Saddlery Adult Amateur Medal Program is designed to specifically recognize and encourage adult amateurs riding at Second Level.

Awards

1. USDF/Dover Saddlery Medal Recipient

The eligible rider with the highest score of 60 percent or better in the designated Second Level Test Three class or applicable test of choice USDF/Dover Saddlery Adult Amateur Medal class at a participating competition will receive a handcrafted USDF/Dover Saddlery pewter medal and neck ribbon. Winners will receive a \$20 Dover Saddlery gift certificate for the first three USDF/Dover Saddlery Medals they win during the competition season.

2. USDF/Dover Saddlery National Merit Award A USDF/Dover Saddlery National Merit Award will be awarded to riders winning three USDF/Dover Saddlery Medals in the same competition year.

3. Year-End Awards The USDF/Dover Saddlery Medal National Champion and Reserve Champion are determined from the average of the top three winning ride scores during the competition year. The champion receives a \$1000 Dover Saddlery gift certificate and the reserve champion receives a \$500 Dover Saddlery gift certificate.

Rider Eligibility

To be eligible, a rider must meet the following criteria:

1. Rider must be a current USDF participating or group member at the time of the competition.
2. Rider must be an adult amateur in accordance with Article GR1306 of the USEF rules and be designated with USEF as an adult amateur as of the competition date.

10. **Ride Times:** Ride times will be mailed to those competitors who furnish a stamped, self-addressed envelope with their entries OR who furnish an e-mail address.
11. **Tests:** 2007 USDF Intro, 2007 USEF, and current Freestyle and F.E.I. tests will be used. Order Intro and Freestyle tests from **USDF** at www.usdf.org. Order Training – 4th and FEI tests from: **USEF** at www.usef.org.
12. **USDF:** Please refer to the “2010 USDF Directory” or visit www.usdf.org for complete rules on Great American Insurance Group/USDF Qualifying classes and Reg. Championship shows.

13. **Arenas:** All tests will be performed inside the Coliseum or in the covered arena adjacent to the Coliseum in the large (20m x 60m) court. Coliseum arena has tanbark footing and the covered arena has sand footing. Warmup area has tanbark footing.
14. **Bedding & Feed:** No initial bedding included. Feed store on grounds: Rex Evans: 217-523-5400. Feed and bedding will be waiting for you if you call ahead.
15. **Camping:** Camping sites are available through the Fairgrounds. Full hook-up camp site: \$25/night. Tent camp site: \$20/night. Call Security at 217.725.0120 to secure a spot.
16. **Dogs:** All dogs must be on a leash no longer than 6' attached to a responsible adult.
17. **Food:** Food will be available for purchase on show grounds on all show days.

19. **Parking:** Permitted in assigned areas only. Fire lanes must be kept open. Non-compliant vehicles will be towed away at owner's expense. **NOTE:** Cars, trucks and trailers may be subject to a parking fee imposed by the Illinois State Fairgrounds.
20. **Stabling:** ABSOLUTELY NO NAILS OR EYE SCREWS ALLOWED IN METAL OR WOOD. Competitors are responsible for stall damage. 10' x 12' permanent stalls with doors. Stabling requests will be honored when possible. **SMOKING IS FORBIDDEN IN BARN AREA.**

21. **Arenas:** Ring 1 is sand and Ring 2 is turf. The large warm-up arena is turf. In case of rain, Training Level Tests (except Qualifying rides) may be held in the indoor sand arena which measures 60' x 120', and is available for warm-up if not being used for competition. (At schooling shows, Intro and First Time Out tests will be held in the indoor arena.)
22. **Hotels near StarWest:** Comfort Inn - 217.787.2250; Fairfield Inn - 217.793.9277; Courtyard by Marriott - 217.793-5300; Hampton Inn & Suites - 217.793.7670
23. **Stabling:** Permanent box stalls with doors. Limited number of stalls available at StarWest. If you have a particular problem, like showing a stallion who makes showing from a trailer more difficult for you, you will receive first preference for these stalls. Otherwise stabling will first be filled at \$25 per night at StarWest; 217.546.9400 or starwestnb@att.net, and then at Sangamon Eq.Ctr at **Cobblestone Fm**, 217.546.6700, 1/2 mile away, in order of entry receipt.

SHOWS HELD AT TOWER HILL EQUESTRIAN CENTER

24. **Arenas:** Outdoor accommodates large dressage arena with warm up around perimeter. This arena will be used for Training - Second Level tests. Indoor arena is 160' x 60' and will be used for Intro Level and Prix Caprilli tests. Both arenas have professional grade “Lightfoot” footing which is a combination sand, material and rubber. In case of severe weather, warm up time will be given in the indoor prior to divisions and/or rides.
25. **Coggins:** Negative coggins required on all horses. Please include a copy with entry form.
26. **Dogs:** Allowed on leash and in hand only. No retractable leashes please.
27. **Stabling:** All stalls are permanent box with doors. Stalls must be reserved ahead and paid with entry fees. Please call ahead to check availability. Initial bedding provided, with additional bedding at \$7.50/bag.
